The credit is converted to a monetary value based on the Company's avoided energy cost for the year. The avoided energy cost represents the wholesale price of electricity (cost to the utility).

Net Metering Summary

This table displays your <u>net energy usage</u> by billing period and the associated charges or credits. For example, if you produced more energy than you consumed, you will see a negative in the "Cumulative net meter energy credit" column. This will be carried forward to the next month and be deducted from the "kWh Billed" column.

Annual True Up Bill

Every 12 months, any remaining balance on your account is billed to you in the form of a True-Up Bill. If you generated more energy than you used, that energy will be applied as credits retroactively to any months you still had a balance. This bill resets to zero every 12-month cycle.
